Application requirements

Successful applicants for the Graduate Certificate of Humanitarian Leadership have:

- at least five years' work experience in an organisation or government body engaged in humanitarian responses, emergency management, development programmes or related areas
- a minimum of three years in a senior management or leadership role
- a strong desire to develop leadership skills to positively impact the future of the aid system
- excellent verbal and written English communication skills, equivalent to level 6.5 IELTS as per Deakin University requirements.

Please note you may be requested to undertake a written test or undergo an interview during the application process.

Further study

Students can directly articulate from the Graduate Certificate of Humanitarian Leadership with the completed units as credit equivalent to one third of the Master of Humanitarian Assistance, or another related masters degree.
